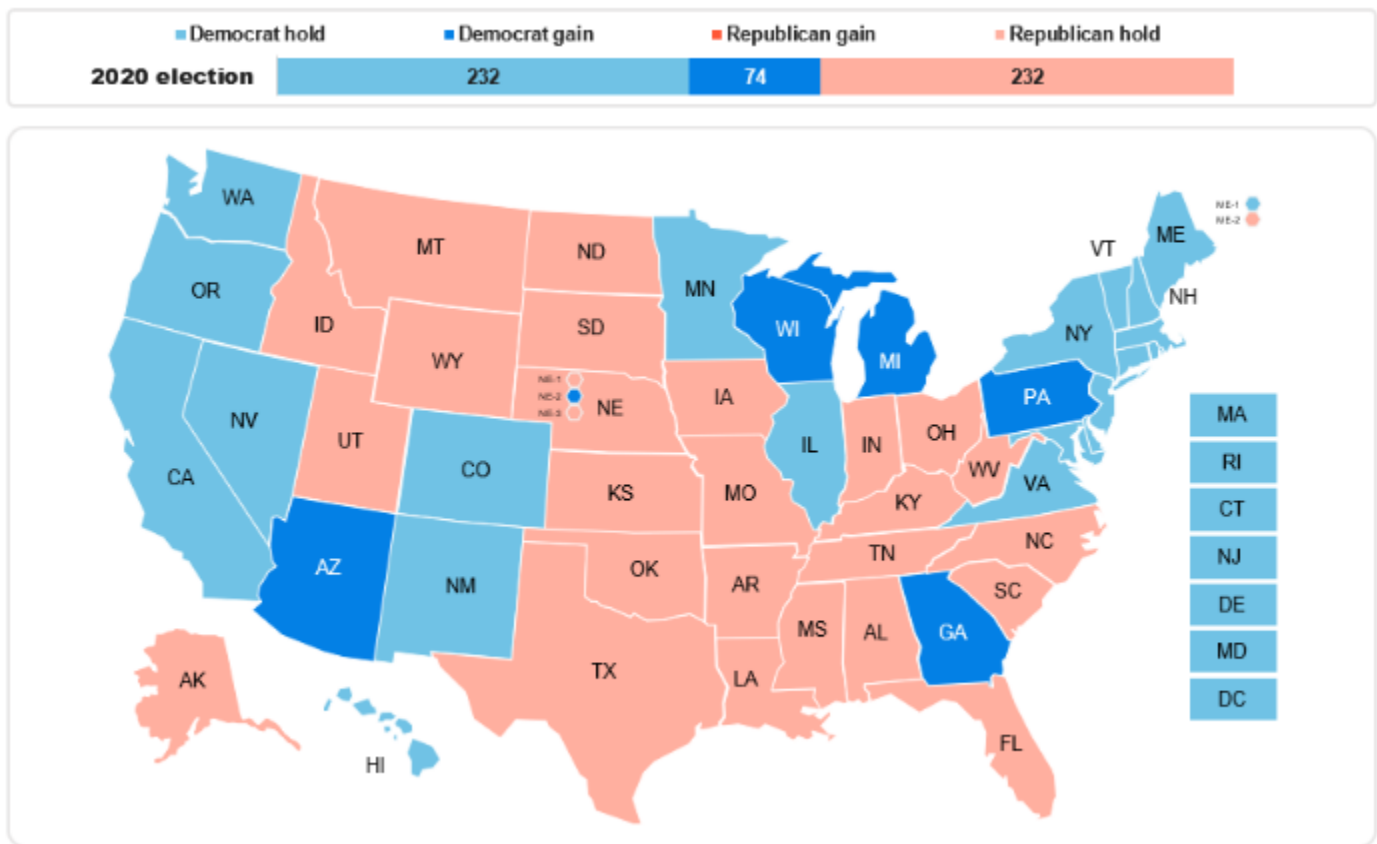
Welcome to the 117th Congress

After a remarkably challenging election season, and the unprecedented assault on the U.S. Capitol this week, the electoral college votes have been certified for the presidential election. As was underscored during that process, and as our elected representatives made clear, the underpinnings of our democracy and the legitimacy of our electoral process was reaffirmed. With one House seat yet to be settled, this alert provides information on the election results to date and includes information on new members joining both chambers.

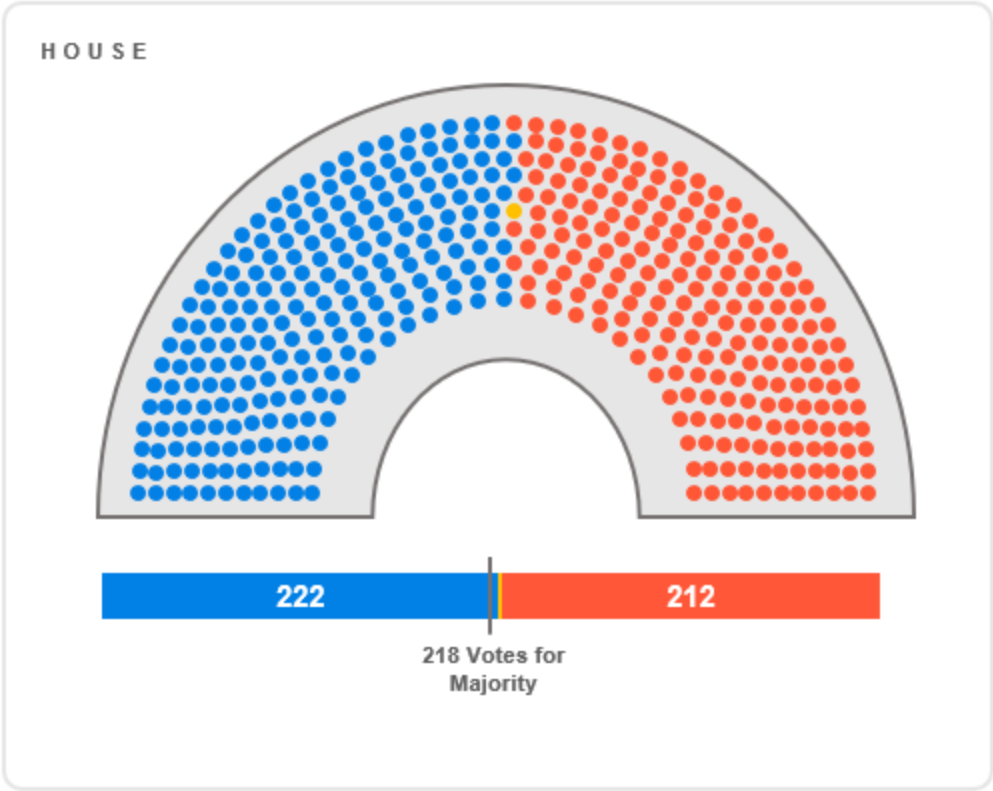

New York's 22nd District: Republican challenger Claudia Tenney is leading Democrat incumbent Anthony Brindisi by 29 votes. The judicial review, which began November 23, remains in progress. There are plans to review about 2,500 contested ballots to determine who won the election.

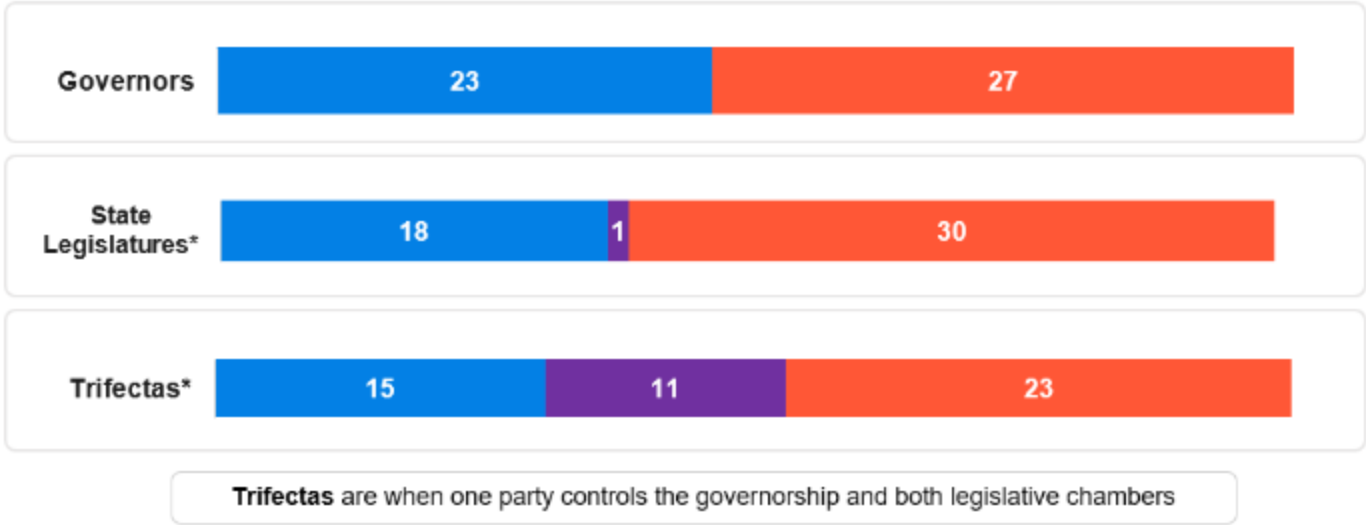
