SYNOPSIS:

Under Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, lotteries and gift enterprises are prohibited. Also, several local provisions of the constitution purport to authorize certain forms of bingo within various counties and municipalities within the state and authorize the regulation of such activity by local sheriffs.

This bill would propose an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to authorize five limited forms of gaming activities: An official state lottery administered by a public lottery corporation, casino-style games conducted only in person at up to seven locally approved licensed gaming establishments, limited sports wagering, traditional raffles, and traditional paper bingo. All other forms of gaming in the state would be prohibited.

The proposed amendment would create the Alabama Gaming Commission to regulate, tax, and license all lawful gaming activity conducted in accordance with general law and would create a law enforcement division within the commission which would police all gaming activities and gaming-related activities across the entire state.

The proposed amendment would prohibit any local



amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022 not applicable to the entire state which relates to lotteries, gift enterprises, casino-style games, sports wagering, gift raffles, or bingo.

The proposed amendment would also authorize the Governor to execute a compact with the Poarch Band of Creek Indians to regulate gaming activities on tribal lands.

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

69 AN ACT

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, relating to lotteries, gift enterprises, and gaming activities; to repeal and reenact Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to authorize certain limited forms of gaming activities; to add a new Section 65.01 to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to establish a gaming commission to regulate and license authorized gaming activities, authorize the Legislature to provide for the membership, powers, and duties of the commission, and establish a law enforcement division within the commission to enforce gaming laws and eradicate unlawful gaming activity and unlawful gaming-related activity; to add Section 65.02 to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to authorize the Legislature to establish and regulate an official state lottery; to add Section 65.03 to the Constitution of

- 96 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 97 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 98 Alabama of 2022, is proposed:
- 99 PROPOSED AMENDMENT
- 100 Part 1. Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022
- is repealed and in lieu thereof the following language shall be
- 102 adopted as Section 65:
- 103 Section 65
- 104 (a) Except as expressly provided in this constitution,
- 105 the Legislature shall have no power to authorize any form of
- 106 gaming activity for any purpose and shall pass laws to prohibit
- 107 and effectively eradicate any unlawful gaming activity and
- 108 unlawful gaming-related activity.
- 109 (b) The Legislature, by general law, may authorize and
- 110 provide for the following gaming activities:
- 111 (1) An official state lottery, administered by a public
- 112 corporation established by general law, using only tickets made



- of cardboard, paper, plastic, or some functionally similar material unless otherwise required to participate in a multijurisdiction lottery.
- 116 (2) Casino-style games played only in person on the 117 premises of a licensed gaming establishment.
- 118 (3) Sports wagering conducted only on events that have
 119 not yet occurred or are already underway.
- 120 (4) Traditional raffles only if registered with the 121 commission.
- 122 (5) Traditional bingo, using only cardboard, paper,
 123 plastic, or some functionally similar material.

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- 124 (c) The Legislature may authorize a form of gaming 125 activity not included in subsection (b) or increase or decrease 126 the rate of taxation on a gaming activity provided by general 127 law only upon the receipt of a favorable report from the 128 commission recommending such action to the Legislature and the passage of a general bill by a vote of three-fifths of all 129 130 members elected to each house of the Legislature taken by yeas 131 and nays and entered upon the journals thereof.
 - (d) The commission shall issue licenses for no more than seven gaming establishments, including the license contemplated by Section 65.04, where casino-style games may be played. The commission's issuance of licenses for the gaming establishments shall be subject to procedures and requirements established by general law, including a local approval requirement.
- 138 (e) Any person that establishes to the satisfaction of 139 the commission that it conducted gaming activities pursuant to 140 the authority of general law or a local provision of the

- this amendment may continue to operate until January 1, 2027, so
- long as the person does all of the following:
- 144 (1) Provides the names and addresses of its principal
- owners and investors, business records, and other information
- 146 required by the commission.
- 147 (2) Provides a sworn statement of its willingness to
- 148 accept the reasonable regulation of the commission and the State
- of Alabama.
- 150 (3) Pays any applicable state taxes as provided by
- 151 general law.
- 152 (4) Provides a description of the gaming activities
- 153 employed in its operation, the methods of delivery of such
- 154 gaming activities, the number of machines or devices used to

- 157 Part 2. Sections 65.01, 65.02, 65.03, and 65.04 are added
- to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to read as follows:
- 159 Section 65.01
- 160 (a) There is established a commission within the
- 161 executive branch of government to protect consumers from
- unscrupulous gaming practices, to ensure the integrity of
- licensed gaming operators, to quickly stop unlawful gaming and
- 164 unlawful gaming-related activities, to mitigate the effects of
- 165 problem gaming, to preserve the aesthetic character of the State
- of Alabama, and to produce revenues that improve the quality of
- life of residents of the state, all pursuant to general law.
- 168 (b) The Legislature, by general law, may provide for the



membership, powers, and duties of the commission and shall
establish a law enforcement division within the commission to
police the conduct of all gaming activities within the state and
to effectively eradicate any unlawful gaming activity or
unlawful gaming-related activity in this state.

Section 65.02

The Legislature, by general law, may provide for the establishment and regulation of an official state lottery that shall be operated and regulated on behalf of the state by a public corporation as an instrumentality of the state under the supervision of the commission. The Legislature may provide for some portion of the proceeds from the lottery to be used to pay the operating expenses of the lottery, including all prizes, without any appropriation required by law. Net proceeds from the lottery shall be deposited at least annually into the State Treasury and shall be separately appropriated by the Legislature.

186 Section 65.03

Beginning on the ratification date of this amendment, any future amendment to this constitution applicable to less than the entire state relating to gaming, including lotteries, gift enterprises, casino-style games, sports wagering, raffles, and bingo, may not take effect and shall be void.

192 Section 65.04

(a) The Governor shall negotiate and may execute a

Tribal-State compact with the Poarch Band of Creek Indians for
the operation and regulation of Class III games and sports
wagering on lands held in trust by the United States for the



benefit of the Poarch Band of Creek Indians, as provided under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq.

- (b) Following execution of the compact, the Governor shall file the compact with the Secretary of State and the commission. The Secretary of State shall forward an executed copy of the compact to the Secretary of the Interior for review and approval in accordance with, and to the extent required by, federal law.
 - (c) In return for the consideration established in the compact contemplated by subsection (a), and for a term as negotiated, the Poarch Band of Creek Indians shall be granted a license, on terms and conditions provided for by general law, to conduct and operate casino-style games at an additional site outside of those lands held in trust.
 - (d) The state's immunity to suit in federal court under the Eleventh Amendment to the United States Constitution is expressly waived for the sole purpose of resolving disputes arising under the terms of any compact negotiated pursuant to this section. The waiver of the state's immunity under this section is contingent upon an equivalent submission in the compact by the Poarch Band of Creek Indians to the jurisdiction of federal court.
- 219 Part 3. The following local provisions of the
 220 Constitution of Alabama of 2022, which purport to authorize or
 221 otherwise relate to bingo or charitable bingo or a lottery or
 222 gift enterprise, are repealed: Sections 8-7.00, 20-7.00, 28223 7.00, 32-7.00, 35-7.00, 37-7.00, 42-7.00, 43A-2.00, 43A-2.01,
 224 44-7.00, 45-7.00, 49-7.00, 51-7.00, 52-7.00, 57-7.00, 64-7.00,



225 and 64A-2.01.

Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: change capitalization, hierarchy, spelling, and punctuation for purposes of style and uniformity; correct manifest grammatical, clerical, and typographical errors; revise internal or external citations and cross-references; and translate effective dates.

END OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws of this state. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to (1) authorize five limited forms of gaming activity: an official state lottery administered by a public lottery corporation, casino-style games played only in person at up to seven locally approved licensed gaming establishments, limited sports wagering, traditional raffles, and traditional paper bingo; (2) establish an Alabama Gaming Commission to regulate licensed gaming, stop unlawful gaming and unlawful gaming-related activity, reduce the effects of problem gaming, preserve the State's aesthetic character, and produce revenues that



improve residents' quality of life; (3) provide a two-year period for phasing out certain activities currently conducted pursuant to local provisions of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022 relating to bingo; and (4) authorize the Governor to execute a compact with the Poarch Band of Creek Indians to regulate gaming activities on tribal land.

Proposed by Act ."

This description shall be followed by the following language:

"Yes () No ()."

Section 3. The proposed amendment shall become valid as a part of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon.
