The program will offer African-American and other minority students the opportunity to learn more about the work of BCRI while introducing students to museology as a professional career.

The deadline for applications is January 28, 2008. BCRI and Baker Donelson will review applications together, and BCRI will select three students from local area colleges, including The University of Alabama at Birmingham, Miles College, Samford University, Birmingham-Southern College, Stillman College, The University of Alabama, and The University of Montevallo to intern during the 2008 calendar year.

The interns will work within various departments of the BCRI operations, including exhibits and programming, archiving, public relations and community events. As part of the Baker Donelson Internship Program, the interns will help coordinate ongoing communication and interaction between Baker Donelson and BCRI, including at least two hands-on work projects each year.
